A. General Discussion

Looking at the schools in which DBH places their SMHP clinicians, all but one are located in high need schools. This answers the question about whether there is an equity problem with SMHP resource allocation.

There is a difference between "at-risk" and "potential risk". A need determination requires student level data and school capacity information. A need determination could tell us something about prioritization – what schools have high risks? Do those schools have resources? What does the YRBS tell us about students' needs?

Maybe we need to consider a low/high split, as our current population level data may not have the nuance needed for low/medium/high.

Need determination has a number of different aspects:

- 1. What can data tell us about the likely level of BH need in each school?
- 2. What resources does the school have already to help meet that need?
- 3. What is the remaining unmet need?
- 4. What is the level of school readiness to meet the need?



B. Does the OSSE At-Risk formula, by itself or in combination or as checked by attendance, Primary Project or YRBS?

OSSE At-Risk ranking includes:

- TANF/SNAP eligibility
- Children in foster care
- Children experiencing homelessness
- HS students 1 year or more older than expected

Dr. Schumacher: Because OSSE doesn't have any student level BH data, suggest keeping IEP data. We need to consider what we can measure today, and what we can measure in the future.

Dr. Price: Suggest looking at suspension data, which if 5% or more (data shows up to 35%) in and of itself is a problem, and informs school culture and decision-making. In-seat attendance not sensitive enough; would need to use chronic absenteeism or truancy data.

Michael Long: Both the EDI and YRBS data can show us citywide prevalence of BH needs that can be compared with available resources to determine the delta, i.e., the need.

Juanita Price: The YRBS is based on student self-report, which is both its strength and its weakness.

Nathan Luecking: We need a birds-eye view that is a relatively accurate way to understand the need. Each school, however, is like a family. And it takes time being on the ground to understand and be able to describe the need.

V. Next Steps

The Subcommittee will provide written responses to the below questions as a way for the Subcommittee to distill its thoughts:

1. What measures do we want to use for initial need determination?



- 2. What is the threshold or method to divide the results into low/high or low/medium/high?
- 3. Once we have a distribution of the need across schools, how does the presence or absence of resource to meet that need factor into our ultimate decision of how to use the need determination in allocating certain resources, such as DBH staff and CBOs?
- 4. What measures do we want to put into place in year 1 that will give us better, more student-specific, or school-specific, or other measures for a revised need determination for future years?
