Requirement to Enroll in the Vaccination for Children (VFC) Program

In accordance with the District of Columbia State Plan for Medical Assistance, all primary care providers rendering Early and Periodic Screening, Diagnosis and Treatment (EPSDT) services are required to participate in the Federal Vaccine for Children (VFC) program. The VFC program is a Centers for Disease Control (CDC) federally funded program that supplies providers with vaccines at no charge for eligible children up to age 18. This program was implemented in the District of Columbia on October 1, 1994.

Effective July 1, 1998, the Medical Assistance Administration (MAA) will no longer reimburse primary care providers for privately purchased vaccines for eligible VFC clients.
