NOTICE OF FUNDING AVAILABILITY

The Department of Health Care Finance (DHCF) announces a Notice of Funding Availability (NOFA) for grant funds pursuant to the authority established by the Fiscal Year 2024 Budget Support Act of 2023, to deliver a Produce Prescription (Produce Rx) program in the District of Columbia. The Director of DHCF has authority to issue grants under Section 6(4) of the Department of Health Care Finance Establishment Act of 2007, effective February 27, 2008 (D.C. Law 17-109; D.C. Official Code 7-771.05(4) (2012 Repl.).

A Request for Application (RFA) for this opportunity will be released under a separate announcement with guidelines for submitting the application, review criteria, and DHCF terms and conditions for applying for and receiving funding. The anticipated performance period for this grant is the date of award to September 30, 2024. This grant is contingent upon available funding.

Description of Opportunities:

<u>Produce Rx Program</u>: One (1) grant of up to \$500,000 to enhance and expand Produce Rx interventions for Medicaid and other public insurance program beneficiaries in the District. Produce Rx programs are a type of Food is Medicine intervention that allow health care providers to issue a "prescription" for healthy food that can be redeemed at food retailers at no cost to the patient. Produce Rx interventions will give health care providers nutritional tools to better manage and coordinate care for patients diagnosed with a diet-related chronic conditions such as diabetes, stroke, heart disease, certain cancers, and HIV.

Eligibility Requirements:

Applicants must have a demonstrated record of administering Food is Medicine programs to Medicaid and other public health insurance program beneficiaries, including integrating Produce Rx programs within clinical workflows and partnering with food retailers to enable use of Produce Rx programs by beneficiaries.

All applicants must also be registered organization in good standing with the DC Department of Consumer and Regulatory Affairs (DCRA), Corporation Division, the Office of Tax and Revenue (OTR), the Department of Employment Services (DOES), and the Internal Revenue Service (IRS), and demonstrate Clean Hands certification at the time of application.

A RFA will be released on or around December 1, 2023. Applicants will receive an email receipt notification to verify that their application has been received No applications will be accepted after the submission deadline. All eligible applications will be reviewed through a competitive process.
